

Let's Wipe Out Worms For A Healthy Body

Guide for Utilization

Objectives:
 1. To motivate learners to recognize vividly how harmful worms (intestinal parasites) are to a healthy body, by comparing a man with worms and a man without them.
 2. To inform learners of practical ways to wipe out the worms.

Target:
 Beginning and middle level of neo-literates in rural areas.

Applications
 1. An instructor shows the poster and, indicating the man with worms, explains his health condition, about his habits and the reasons why there are worms in his body, pointing at each illustration.
 2. Then, the instructor explains the health condition of the man without worms, indicating him on the poster and what he does every day, pointing at each illustration and indicating why he doesn't have any worms in his body.

3. If possible, instructor explains the infection route of worms as follows.

      A[Eggs become adult worms which lay eggs inside the body.] --> B[Eggs enter the body through the mouth via vegetables and dirty hands.]
      B --> C[Eggs go out of the body with human waste.]
      C --> D[Eggs are spread around by the wind and stick to hands and vegetables.]
      D --> A
    
```

4. Points of interest and problems concerning the worms are taken up in question-and-answer and discussion amongst learners with instructor.
 5. The instructor suggests to the learners how to wipe out the worms and stay healthy.
