



## Teaching and Learning with East Asian Shared Heritage

### Call for participants

As part of the Asia-Pacific regional initiative to promote the integration of living heritage in the classrooms, UNESCO Regional Office for East Asia, in partnership with UNESCO Category 2 Centers CRIHAP and ICHCAP, will implement a project in East Asia during 2024-2025. For information on the broader regional initiative and specific activities in East Asia, please refer to the attached Concept Note.

We are looking for 3-5 participants from each East Asian country to join our project.

#### In joining our project, the participants are expected to:

- Attend a 3-day capacity building workshop, tentatively scheduled for September/October 2024 in China.
- Collaborate with other project participants to develop teaching materials on East Asia's shared heritage, under the mentorship of partner organizations and cultural experts.
- Carry out 1-2 pilot lessons in a local school to test the teaching materials.
- Commit to promote the teaching and learning with living heritage methodology and the materials developed within the scope of the project.
- Attend other project related workshops or symposia if requested.
- The costs to attend the workshop(s) will be covered by the partner organizations. A modest fund for the pilot process can also be covered by the partner organizations if needed. There will be no fee provided for participating in the project.

#### Expected profile of participants:

- Be a lecturer at a Teacher's Training University in an East Asian country (China, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Japan, Mongolia, and Republic of Korea).
- Be able to use English as a working language (both speaking and writing competences).
- Be interested in opportunities to engage in international projects and collaborate with international partners.
- Be able to dedicate the time needed (approximately 2 weeks) over the course of 2024-2025 to participate in the project.
- Have support from the University's authorities to participate in the project.
- Have existing partnership with a local school to organize the pilot lesson(s).

**Desired profile of participants:** in addition to the expected profile, the following will also be encouraged:

- Receive the financial support from the University to attend the workshops (e.g. to cover flight tickets)

and for lessons pilot.

- Receive the commitment from the University's authorities to mainstream teaching and learning with living heritage approach in the university activities.
