Reflecting activities





Additionally, we had the opportunity to observe teaching methods and organize cultural activities for Japanese students, sharing Thai culture with them.



Providing opportunities for Thai teachers to participate in learning teaching processes and engaging in activities with teachers and students from Japan is something that should be continued. Moreover, the time spent on such activities should be increased, as it is the only way to foster a deeper understanding, which is far more effective than verbal presentations alone.



It is an activity that allows for direct exchange of knowledge with teachers, sharing experiences in teaching within our own contexts. We also engaged in discussions on issues and problem-solving approaches from each side. I was impressed by the process of creating special classrooms to accommodate students who are not ready or do not want to learn with their peers in the regular classroom. Active Global Citizen

Integrating SDGs content into the teaching of English for reading and writing

By using various media and organizing activities both in and outside the classroom

To raise students' awareness of the importance of education and the collaboration required to develop, solve, and prevent problems to create a sustainable learning society and development



Collaboration & Creativity

Organizing joint activities between Satorihaiyaphum School, Zao Primary School, Nigata Junior High School, and Hiroshima University to promote collaboration between students and teachers from both countries. The aim is to organize teaching and learning activities that encourage and inspire creativity among students in creating a joyful classroom environment, by integrating SDGs content as the main goal for sustainable global social development.

This is a collaborative project that involves:

- Classroom-to-classroom exchanges
- Students from both countries
- Teachers from both countries
- Jointly developed teaching materials
- Organizing at least 1-4 joint teaching activities per semester
- Students participating in selecting activities and topics of interest



Cultural Exchange

Program

The language and cultural exchange program is organized to facilitate exchanges for students, teachers, and educational administrators between the two countries in the form of family sponsorship. This program will provide opportunities for students to learn together and for teachers to exchange knowledge and collaborate in teaching.

The exchange period may be:

- Short-term: 1-4 weeks
- Short-term: 1 semester
- Long-term: 1 academic year
