1. The Education System of Japan

- Integration of Knowledge with Daily Life:** The Japanese curriculum focuses on enabling students to apply knowledge in their daily lives.

Steps

1. Meeting with school administrators to set goals and strategies for knowledge transfer, gathering relevant information, experiences, and teaching materials.
2. Developing Teaching Media: Creating teaching materials such as slides and videos based on experiences gained from participating in activities.
3. Publicizing Information to teachers and students about the project and gathering participants who are interested in.
4. Design club students will design and create New Year's cards and thank you cards. Between December 1st and 10th, 2024, the New Year cards will be collected and sent to Japan.



Expected results

1. Thai teachers and students are inspired and gain new ideas for educational development.
2. Second-grade students at Zao Primary School received New Year's greeting cards from Thai students.
