Findings from the programme

I got a glimpse of the benefits of instilling a common philosophy, such as Happy Learning and Buddhist values

I felt that there have more in common with Japanese pupils/students than differences. I thought I could collaborate in many ways, such as in lessons and in coming up with problemsolving ideas.

Through the communication between the participants, I was able to see my own issues and what I need to work on. The connections made through the programme were the most valuable asset.
